Safely Dispose of Your Toxic Waste

Take your unwanted or unused toxic household products to a Sunnyvale Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event. Never dispose of toxics in the garbage or down household and storm drains.

ACCEPTS

- Aerosols
- Automotive fluids
- Batteries
- Compressed gas cylinders (5-gallons or smaller)
- Fire extinguisher
- Fuels
- Fluorescents tubes/bulbs
- Household chemicals/cleaners
- Paints
- Pesticides/Herbicides
- Pharmaceuticals (or bring to any Sunnyvale Fire Station)
- Pool chemicals
- Mercury-containing items
- Sharps/syringes/lancets/needles
- Smoke detectors

Materials Not Accepted

- Ammunitions
- Explosives
- Radioactive waste

Recycling Center

The SMaRT Station is operated by Bay Counties Waste Services for the cities of Mountain View, Palo Alto and Sunnyvale

Services

- Recycling Center
- Buy-Back Center
- Self-haul disposal
- Compost and mulch pick-up available at no charge to residents of Sunnyvale, Mountain View, Palo Alto, and Los Altos (Mulch only available June 1st thru Sept 30th)
- Group tours offered by appointment

Recyclables Accepted

- Clothes and shoes
- Containers, cartons, bottles, and cans (metal, plastic and glass; no auto/window glass, no ceramics, no mirrors)
- Paper and corrugated cardboard

Recyclables Accepted In Residential Quantities Only

- Electronics: computers, TVs, monitors (limit four), small appliances, carbon monoxide detectors
- Fluorescent bulbs and tubes
- Strings of holiday lights
- Mercury items: thermostats, thermometers (intact only)
- Sharps (needles and lancets in red biohazard containers)
- Paint (Monday through Friday only)
- Cooking oil*
- Used motor oil and oil filters, antifreeze*
- Household and auto batteries (clearly labeled & non-leaking**)

**Limit is 10 gallons in 1-gallon capacity plastic containers or smaller with screw-top lids*

***Other limitations apply*

Self-Haul

- Residents and businesses of Mountain View, Palo Alto and Sunnyvale may dispose of trash at the SMaRT Station
- Businesses must provide a valid business license from one of the three cities to dispose of trash
- Residents must provide a valid form of identification
- Disposal rates are determined by types of materials disposed per cubic yard or on a per unit basis

Tarp Cover Required: State law requires that all incoming loads at the SMaRT station must be covered by a tarp [State Vehicle Code 23114(a)]. Uncovered loads will be provided a tarp for a fee of \$15.00.
