PAPER

Place in Dark Blue Bin

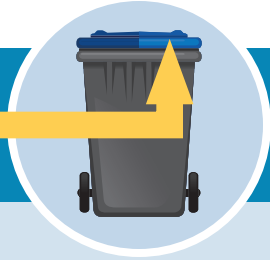


NO plastic bags, containers, food, garbage, or hazardous materials.

CONTAINERS

Place in Light Blue Bin

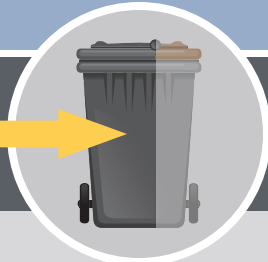


NO plastic bags, paper, food, garbage, or hazardous materials.

GARBAGE

BASURA 垃圾

Place in Grey Lid Side of Split Cart

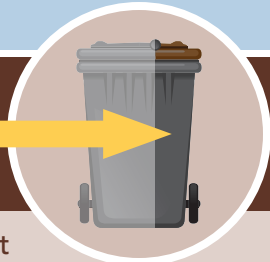


NO food scraps, recyclables, or hazardous materials.

FOOD SCRAPS

DESECHOS ALIMENTICIOS 食物残渣

Place in Brown Lid Side of Split Cart



Put scraps in clear plastic or compostable bags only.
NO paper, containers, garbage, yard trimmings, or hazardous materials

How to Get Rid of Everything Else



What can I drop off at SMaRT Station?

Residents can drop these items off at 301 Carl Rd. seven days a week for no charge.

- Electronics
- Clothing, shoes, accessories
- Paint
- Mattresses
- Cooking oil, motor oil, antifreeze
- Empty gas cylinders – one-pound, three cylinders per household
- Household and auto batteries – tape terminal ends
- Fluorescent bulbs and tubes

Have unused household hazardous waste or medications?

These items should never be disposed in the garbage.



For hazardous waste items, make a drop-off appointment at HHW.org or call 408-299-7300.

For unused or unneeded medications, go to sccmeds.org to find a drop-off or mail-in option.

What about donating or selling?

Consider donating or selling outgrown clothing, toys and games, electronics, furniture, bedding and household goods rather than throwing them away. Post items on a community bulletin board, or sell them on sites like Nextdoor, Craigslist, Facebook Marketplace and eBay. Use Freecycle.org (enter Sunnyvale, CA) or TrashNothing.com to offer your items to neighbors for free.
